To schedule bulk pickup, call **903-874-8717** by the Thursday before pickup. Accepted items include furniture, appliances, brush, and bundled moving boxes. Construction debris, tires, and hazardous waste are not accepted.

Code Corner: Keeping Frost Clean & Safe

January's focus in Frost is on helping neighborhoods stay tidy, safe, and welcoming. Here's what residents should know:

Trash Carts:

- Place carts at the curb no earlier than the evening before pickup.
- Return carts to the side or rear of the house by the evening of pickup day.
- Proper storage helps keep streets clear and complies with city ordinances.

Junk & Property Conditions:

- Properties must be kept free of junk, debris, and excessive rubbish.
- This includes discarded furniture, appliances, loose trash, or uncontained materials.

Bulk Pickup:

- Scheduled for the last Friday of each month.
- Call 903-874-8717 to schedule or visit Republic Services Bulk Pickup.
- Accepted items: furniture, appliances, bundled brush (≤ 4 ft / ≤ 50 lbs).
- Not accepted: construction debris, tires, hazardous waste.

Nuisances:

- Residents are reminded that tall grass, weeds, and other nuisances must be managed in accordance with city codes to keep properties safe and attractive.

Following these guidelines helps all Frostites enjoy cleaner streets, safer neighborhoods, and a more pleasant community. Thank you for doing your part!
